Introduction and Overview

> The Initial Preferred Route (IPR) was announced in January 2013 - nearly six years ago - the uncertainty has caused a great deal of stress to my constituents. While this consultation is welcomed it is important that outstanding design and integration issues are urgently resolved.
> In the response to the "Line of route consultation" in 2013 the primary concerns raised were the viaduct in Church Fenton and the close proximity of the line to homes on the Sandwath estate.
> Additionally more fundamental questions were raised about the integration of HS2 services with suburban Leeds to York, freight on the Normanton line and the fast East Coast Mainline services which is not joined until Colton Junction i.e there are two HS2 junctions, not one.
> The other comment submitted at that time was that London to Newcastle HS2 services would not be able to stop in Leeds - which is a further integration issue.

Scope of comments in response to the WDES Consultation

- > The Working Draft ES (WDES) includes details of the construction process, construction depots, access routes for construction and mitigation measures for the environmental impact of the new railway on the surrounding area. Local residents, Parish Councils and Selby District Council have been encouraged to respond on these points because they have the required local knowledge.
 > The higher level concern is that the configuration of the junction between Church Fenton and Ulleskelf is not yet finalised. The junction configuration determines whether a viaduct is required and the height of any viaduct. This is essential input to the Landscape and Visual Impact Assessment (LVIA). Similarly the height of the viaduct and sound mitigation measures have an influence both on visual impact and on noise contours and Noise Impact Assessment (NIA).
 > The design is seen to be evolving in that the IPR showed HS2 joining the Eastern pair of tracks via a grade separated junction but the WDES (after clarification because of differing presentation within the documents) now shows HS2 joining the western pair with only the existing downline having to be crossed.
- > The design as presented in the WDES is incomplete because it does not resolve the integration issues which were raised nearly 6 years ago. The following more detailed design issues stand out
 - > Lowering of Common Lane this unlikely to be acceptable because it is a flood plain
- > The use of the Western Pair is more logical than the Eastern Pair and could provide a fast path all the way into York. However the design is incomplete because matters such as HS2 touch points and Northern Powerhouse Rail (NPR) integration are still not defined.

Summary

Taking the above points together the WDES consultation cannot be completed for this section of HS2 because boundary issues concerning integration, funding agreement and junction design are yet to be finalised. The need for a viaduct is unclear. The ES states that it will take 4 years to build, the viaduct is a major consideration for construction sites and access. The viaduct is major consideration for the LVIA and NIA.

Until these matter are resolved this consultation on the WDES should be treated as provisonal.

2. Do you have any suggestions about additional information or assessments that should be included in the Environmental Statement?

Church Fenton to York


The assessment should be extended from the junction with the Leeds to York Line at least as far as Colton Junction and ideally to York Station.

The IPR included a grade separated junction where HS2 joined the Leeds to York line but did not provide any detail of how HS2 and would join with the faster, busier East Coast Mainline which it joins at Colton. Neither does it deal with how HS2 trains will be accommodated in York Station.

If trains are to run at high speed all the way into York then this should be dealt with by an extension to the ES because of noise and visual impact.

Touch point

If there is to be a touch point between Leeds and Church Fenton then this should also be within the scope of the ES.



3. Do you have any other comments?

The Initial Preferred Route (IPR) was announced in January 2013 - nearly six years ago - the uncertainty has caused a great deal of stress to my constituents. While this consultation is welcomed it is important that outstanding design and integration issues are urgently resolved.

Given that the configuration of the junction is still being reviewed it will be important to consult again when the design is finalised and LVIA and NIA is available for the design that will go forward for inclusion in the Hybrid Bill.

While proximity of the line to homes on Sandwath estate has been a major concern since the IPR was announced and the community has engaged with the consultation process it is dissapointing that the recently released draft plans show the line closer to homes on Sandwath estate than originally proposed.

If the viaduct could be designed out it would

- > Save money
- > Enable the line to be moved further away from Sandwath estate
- > Enable construction time for this section to be reduced from the 4 years required for a viaduct.
- > Reduce visual impact across the flood plain
- > While facilitating better integration
